Scotton Parks

Scotton has 6 parks which we are responsible for as a Parish Council, some of these parks require substantial maintenance. All parks are independently inspected, weekly and annually which is paid for by the Parish Council.

Mallard Park, Falcon Park, Scotton Gardens, Oak Tree

Hawthorne Park is our largest play park and has just undergone a large refurbishment, which was only possible through a successful grant application from Awards For All. The park is looking amazing and we have had lots of positive feedback from parents and children enjoying it.

Meane Park we are at the point where we are applying to North Yorkshire Council to change the use of this park to a sanctuary garden. To hear plans and find out how we are getting on please look out for the minutes from our parish meetings.

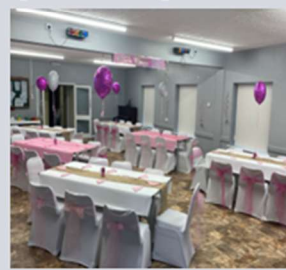

Dog owners

Unfortunately the dog poo situation is causing a lot of distress to residents who are having to clean up other peoples dog poo on their properties. Also residents are standing in the dog fowl when out walking on Scotton paths. There are several dog poo bins around Scotton for you to place your bagged poo into. If you find a bin that is full please take your bags home and report the bin as full to <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/bins-recycling-and-waste/street-cleaning-and-littering> North Yorkshire Council is going to put up some dog fowl notices on lamp posts, please can you let the Parish Council know the number of the lamp post you would like them on.

Dog walking park

We have received complaints regarding people using the dog park very early and late on a night, please respect the neighbours and ensure your dog isn't barking throughout their time in the park.

Please remember when using the dog walking park you are responsible for picking up your dogs poo, keep it clean for others and the poor grass cutters that keep the area nice for your dogs.
